Hampton Roads Post 2014-2015 Scholarship Information

The Society of American Military Engineers (SAME), Hampton Roads Post intends to award multiple \$500 - \$2,000 scholarships to Engineering, Architecture, Interior Design and Construction Management Students for the 2014-2015 school year.

Applicants must be enrolled, or planning to enroll, in a full-time undergraduate Engineering, Architecture, Interior Design or Construction Management degree program at an accredited college or university in the fall term of 2014. All applicants must also have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 basis) to be eligible to apply. The minimum GPA requirement applies to both high school and college students. No scholarship will be awarded for those pursuing an associate, second undergraduate or graduate school degree. Students attending a community or junior college must be enrolled in a program of studies designed to allow the student to transfer directly into a four-year program.

There is no requirement for the student or parent to be part of a SAME Post. However, preference will be given to students who are members of a SAME Student Post or

whose parents, guardians, or sponsors are members of SAME. Sponsors must provide a letter of recommendation as part of the application package. For a list of sustaining member companies, and student SAME applications please refer to our [website](#).

The completed application, including transcripts, must be emailed or postmarked no later than March 31, 2014.

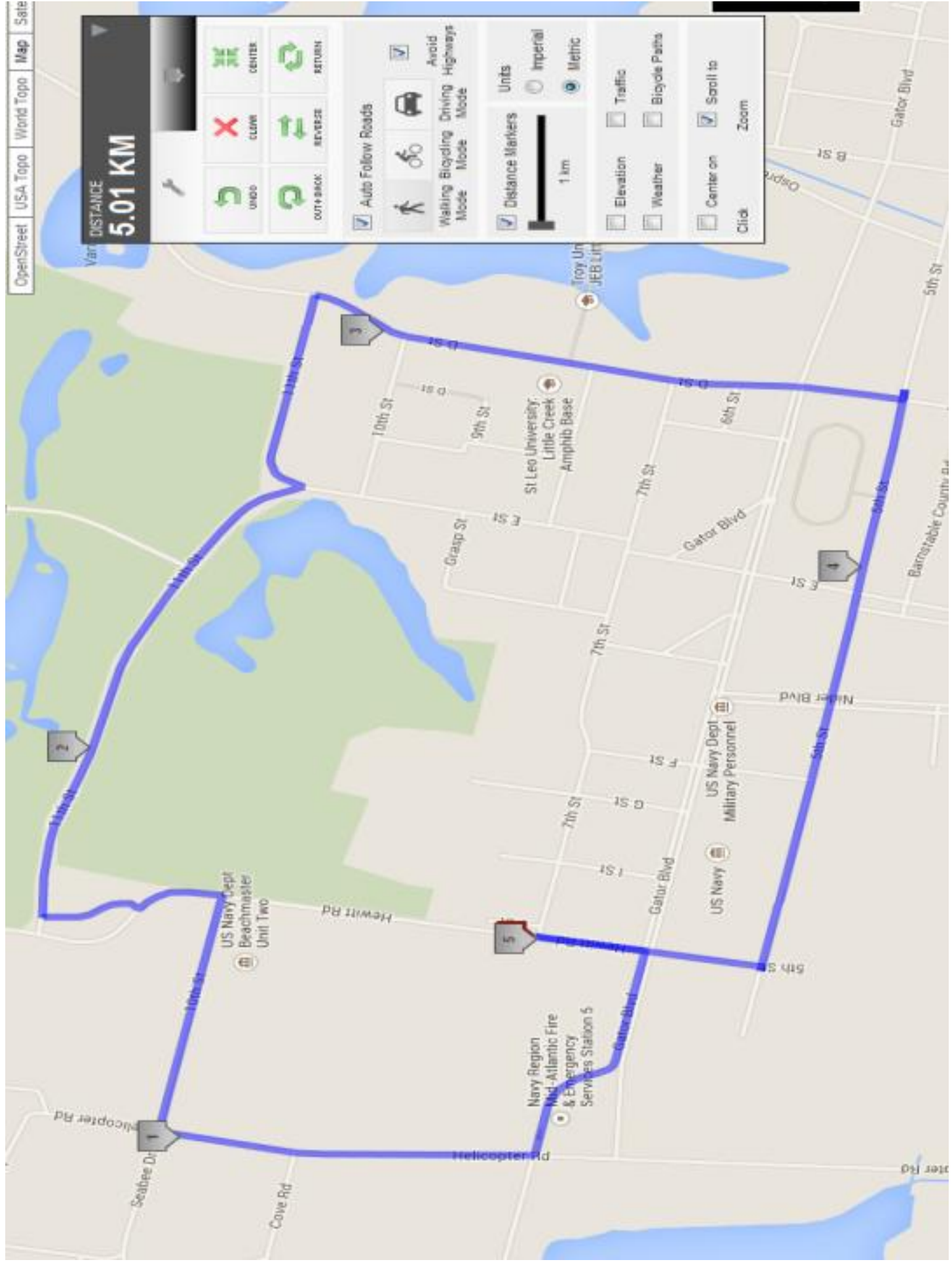

Guidelines for Presentations

To improve the chances that your proposal will be accepted for inclusion, please consider the following:

- Concurrent technical sessions will last 90 minutes. They should include no more than 75 minutes of presentation followed by at least 15 minutes for questions.
- Presentation proposals should clearly outline the presentation's subject and content, and how it applies to the conference theme of Navigating the New Normal: Partnerships for the Future. The topic should be of relevance to the military A/E/C community, and provide unique, insightful and useful content.
- We invite professionals from all types of organizations, including those who are working in the public sector, to submit proposals.
- Please do not submit a proposal unless you will be willing to make a presentation on any of the conference dates (sessions will be presented on November 13 and 14).

Presentation Submission Requirements

Please prepare a concise and thorough response containing the following:

- Suggested technical track
- Presentation title -- this information will be used in the printed program
- Session abstract (a maximum of 75 words that describes your presentation and what people will learn).
NOTE: this description will be placed in the printed program
- Professional expertise of session presenter(s) (a paragraph of 50 words maximum for each presenter describing their relevance to the presentation)
- Define the delivery and presentation medium intended. Effective use of graphics, research and data, and use of appropriate media are encouraged for presentations.
- Identify if your session will need a moderator.
- Name, title, address, telephone, and e-mail address for the primary contact person. This person will be the point of contact with the SAME Programs Committee and will be responsible for communicating with all co-presenters regarding all correspondence concerning the conference.

How to Submit

- Proposals are due by 4:00pm on **April 9, 2014**.
- Proposals should be submitted electronically Katherine Ollinger at kollinger@eypae.com with the subject line *SAME Call for Presentations*
- The point of contact in the proposal will be notified of their status by June 13, 2014
- Complimentary registration will be provided to presenters. Presenters are otherwise financially responsible for conference attendance and all expenses involved in the delivery of all presentations. There will be no stipends or reimbursed expenses provided to presenters by SAME or those individuals involved in administering the SAME Mid-Atlantic Regional Conference.
